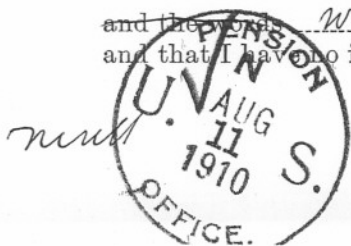

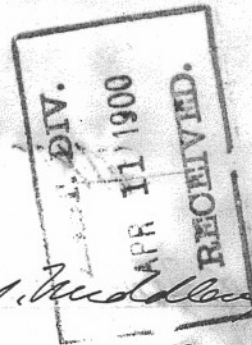

And that in the fall of 1869 said Emory J. Brown was in his employ picking apples and owing to the ladder slipping said Brown fell from a tree a distance of about fifteen feet. breaking one wrist (right hand). and breaking right hip. he assisted in carrying said Emory J. Brown into the house. he also testifies that said Emory J. Brown has never fully recovered from these injuries. he also testifies that said Emory J. Brown is and always has been a sober and industrious man and that his injuries were in no way due to any vicious habits. and he further declares that he has no interest in said case and is not concerned in its prosecution.

Dear Sir;

I enclose this letter from the Pension Bureau to me dated Feb. 9 / 1893 asking for evidence of origin of injury to back.

This is the third call since last summer that I have received for this same evidence.

I have procured this evidence on each of the previous calls for it, and sent it to Washington making two times that I have furnished it, already.

On each of the two times, I furnished it by means of the affidavits of two reputable citizens of Stow Mass, stating fully and explicitly when, where, and how the injury to his back occurred, and that it occurred by his falling from a cherry tree,
(over.)

I state upon my honor, as an attorney at law, in good standing, of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and as a recognized attorney of the Interior Department at Washington D.C., that I have truly furnished the evidence as to origin of injury to back, by means of the affidavits (in proper form, duly sworn to ^{and} executed) of two reputable citizens of Stow Mass, in which town the said Soldier Emory J. Brown lives, that within six weeks I have sent to the Pension Bureau an affidavit that said Emory J. Brown, has no means of support, is unable to earn his living, ^{and} is entirely dependent upon others for the necessities of life.
