Sir:

Replying to your letter of November 17, 1915, Portland 04586, FS/D, WAW, I have to advise you that the only Daniel Cronin who served on the U.S.S. "Vanderbilt" and whose name is borne on the records of this Bureau, is one Daniel Cronin who is shown by a report from the records of the Navy Department on file in the claim of the minors of the said Daniel Cronin, certificate number 9090, to have enlisted July 3, 1861; served on the U.S.S. "North Caro.", "Iroquois", "Vanderbilt", and "Galatea", and to have been discharged June 24, 1864, as an ordinary seaman.

The signature of said Daniel Cronin is not borne on the records of this Bureau.

The evidence on file in the above-entitled claim shows that he was married May 29, 1874 to Ellen Foley in New York City and that he died June 20, 1885 also in New York City.

The evidence in the said claim further shows that his widow Ellen Cronin died August 29, 1892, and that the names and dates of

birth of the children of the sailor were as follows:

Bridget A., born November 24, 1876;

Thomas, born December 3, 1880, and

Mary E., born November 23, 1882;

all of said children appear to have been born in New York City.

Other than as above indicated the places of the sailor's residence are not shown.

The pension in the above claim terminated November 22, 1898, the date the youngest child attained the age of sixteen years and therefore, the present post-office address of none of the sailor's relatives at this time is known to the Bureau.

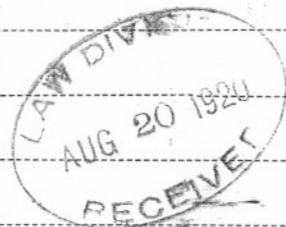
