DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

THE PENSION CERTIFICATE SHOULD NOT BE FORWARDED WITH THE APPLICATION.

On this 23^d day of February, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and Seven, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the county and State aforesaid, Isaac W. Fletcher, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is 83 years of age, and a resident of Stow, county of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Camp Stearns Gorton Junction under the name of Isaac W. Fletcher, on the 17th day of October, 1862, as a Private, in Co. D. 53^d Regiment Massachusetts Infantry.

Fletcher, the claimant, sign his name (or make his mark) to the foregoing declaration; that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the claimant and their acquaintance with him of 25 years and 60 years, respectively, that he is the identical person he represents himself to be, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.



[EXTRACT FROM THE REVISED LAWS, CHAPTER 29.]

SECTION 13. The clerk of each city and town shall forthwith make certified copies of the records of all * * * deaths recorded during the previous month if the * * * deceased was a resident of any other city or town in this Commonwealth or in any other state at the time of said * * * death, and transmit them to the clerk of the city or town of which such * * * deceased person was a resident at the time of said * * * death, stating if practicable the name of the street and number of the house, if any, where such * * * deceased person so resided; and the clerk of a city or town in this Commonwealth so receiving such certified copies, or certified copies of * * * deaths from the clerk of a city or town without the Commonwealth, shall record the same.
