# DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

THE PENSION CERTIFICATE SHOULD NOT BE FORWARDED WITH THE APPLICATION.

On this 22nd day of February, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and seven, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State aforesaid, James B. Lord, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is 63 years of age, and a resident of Maynard county of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Fort Warren, Boston Harbor under the name of James B. Lord, on the 10th day of August, 1864, as a private, in Company C, First Battalion of Heavy Artillery Massachusetts Volunteers (Here state rank, and company and regiment in the Army, or vessels if in the Navy) in the service of the United States, in the Civil war, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Fort Warren, Boston Harbor, on the 20th day of October, 1865. That he also served \_\_\_\_\_ (Here give a complete statement of all other services, if any.)

That he was not employed in the military or naval service of the United States otherwise than as stated above. That his personal description at enlistment was as follows: Height, five feet nine inches; complexion, Light; color of eyes, Blue; color of hair, Light; that his occupation was Book-keeper; that he was born January 2nd, 1844, at Lancashire, England.

That his several places of residence since leaving the service have been as follows: At Amesbury Massachusetts from date of discharge until July 1868 and at Maynard, Massachusetts from July 1868 until present time (State date of each change, as nearly as possible.)

That he is \_\_\_\_\_ a pensioner. That he has heretofore applied for pension and his certificate is numbered 1119-442. (If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of February 6, 1907.

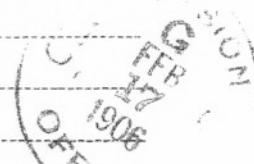
