Co. E. 6th Mass. Infantry at Harvard Mass., on the 31st day of August

A. D. 1862, Discharged on 3d day of June 1863.

Again enlisted as Sergeant Co. E. 6th Mass. Infantry Harvard Mass. on 18th

day of July 1864, and served at least ninety days in the war of the rebellion, and was honorably discharged at Exp. of Service (not time) on the 27th day of October 1864

and who died at Harvard, Mass. on the 29th day of December 1896.

(That he was a pensioner of the United States under Certificate No. _____, or, he was an applicant for invalid Pension No. 1091.987.) which was rejected April 29, 1893.

That she was married under the name of Sarah Marcia Sawyer Frost to said George L. Sawyer on the 2d day of January June A.D. 1861, by _____ at Harvard.
