

- 1 To see if the Town will Reconsider their note that they  
will set thare meetinghouse on the Centre and agree to  
set it on sum other Place & bear the Centre for Convenency
- 2 To see if the Town will agree to make any Preparation  
for ye year Inservino towards building a meetinghouse or any  
other things Relating thereto
- 3 To see whither the Town will do any thing further Relating  
to the first article of the Last meeting  
and the warrant was Directed to the Two Constables viz  
Jonathan Wheeler & Amos Prescutt and the Inhabitants of  
the Town of Acton met and Proceeded as followeth
- Acton Court y<sup>e</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1735
- At a Generall Town meeting of the Inhabitants of the  
above Town propounded whether they will Reconsider their  
note that they will set thare meeting house in the  
Centre voted they will not Reconsider
- 2 To see if the Town will make any preparation towards  
building a meetinghouse voted they will do nothing on  
that article
- 3 On y<sup>e</sup> third article voted that Cor<sup>r</sup> Joseph Wright be added  
to Smt John Heale to manage the Petition at the Graal and  
General Court
- Then the meeting was Dismissed

Acton 24<sup>th</sup> 1735

The Selectmen of Town met and agreed on a Town  
meeting to be on the first monday of December 1735

To have the Surveyors Report that was Chosen to find  
the Centre

- 2 To see if the Town will Reconsider their note that they

an axe and allleded to be the Centre by Ebnezer Prescutt  
or to see if the Town will agree to measure from the  
extrem Corners and find the Centre and Chuse men for  
that purpos and the warrant was Committed to the Two  
Constables viz Jonathan Wheeler and Amos Prescutt and  
the Inhabitants met on y<sup>e</sup> day above to and  
Proceed and Dismissed the two articles above to and the  
the meeting was Dismissed
