 oak so to a white oak mark so to an Elm tree ~~tree~~ three mark  
 then turning E<sup>stwardly</sup> to a Pine tree marked South of heathing meadow  
 in y<sup>e</sup> brook that cometh out of y<sup>e</sup> Swamp South of heathing meadow  
 then to a Pine tree being the Northw<sup>ly</sup> Corner of the f<sup>or</sup>mer  
 called Maj<sup>r</sup> Willard's house: then to a woodlot tree marked then  
 to a black oak tree by John Cragen's Land to a black oak so to a white oak  
 by Jo Cragen's Corner then bending on Jo Cragen's Lane then Running  
 E<sup>stwardly</sup> to the meeting house y<sup>e</sup> marks are on the North side of y<sup>e</sup>  
 way of selectmen that Laid this way was

 by marks and bounds, w<sup>ch</sup> Beginning at a stake near Thom<sup>s</sup> Road then on  
 to a black oak marked then to a heap of stones E<sup>stwardly</sup> of Mr<sup>s</sup> Joseph  
 Wethers house then to a pine tree marked in Jo Fletcher's Land so to an  
 other pine tree marked then as y<sup>e</sup> wall standeth to the brook so over  
 the bridge so onward to a Rock then turning Northw<sup>ly</sup> then to Sam<sup>l</sup>  
 Dauris's ~~house~~ fence and so on toward Jo Davis's house as y<sup>e</sup> way is now  
 used then on y<sup>e</sup> Jo occupied way to oak tree by John Davis's house  
 then E<sup>stwardly</sup> to a pine marked then turning Northward through  
 second Division Land then through Land of the Laws to y<sup>e</sup> old way  
 that Leads to Concord then Leaving the Jo ~~to~~ way and turning  
 Northwardly where y<sup>e</sup> way is now occupied to a pine tree marked Near  
 y<sup>e</sup> bridge so over y<sup>e</sup> bridge and onward by Sam<sup>l</sup> Sheperd's house y<sup>e</sup> wall  
 to be y<sup>e</sup> bounds of y<sup>e</sup> way and so along the old way then Leaving the  
 y<sup>e</sup> old way that goeth to Mr<sup>s</sup> Parkers on the Left hand Near a Denty  
 puddle Place then to a black oak marked then to a white oak marked  
 then to a white oak then turning Northw<sup>ly</sup> to a ~~white~~ white oak marked  
 then to a white oak marked then North to a Poplar marked in an hundred  
 acre Lot Drawed by Sam<sup>l</sup> Blood then to a black oak marked and so  
 on as the trees are marked to the meeting house Place so on from  
 y<sup>e</sup> meeting house Place to a black oak marked then to a white oak marked  
 then to a white oak marked where Strawberry hill away meets y<sup>e</sup> way of  
 then to a black oak marked then to a white oak marked in an hundred acre  
 Lot Drawed by y<sup>e</sup> heirs of Maj<sup>r</sup> Prescott then to a black oak marked  
 in Jo Lott then to a pine tree marked in an hundred acres & Drawed by  
 Georg Robbers then to a Poplar then to a Red oak tree marked in a  
 y<sup>e</sup> hundred acre Lot of Maj<sup>r</sup> Prescott Heirs afores<sup>d</sup> so to a good  
 white oak tree marked to a Elm tree marked in Jo Lott to a Red oak  
 then across Neagoy brook to a black oak marked in an hundred acre  
 Lot Drawed by Capt William Willson of Concord to a pine tree  
 marked then across Littleton Road and so by marks through  
 second Division and Common Land as is marked untill it  
 cometh to Thomas Sheblers's house then between Jo Sheblers  
 house and Barn and so on the way as now occupied untill  
 it cometh to Cometh to over y<sup>e</sup> bridge then to a black oak tree  
 then to a white oak then to a black oak marked then
