in John Davis's Land then to a Poplar marked then to a black oak
tree marked then to a white oak marked so to a white oak tree
tree marked near y line between Lt Davis and Hezekiah Reed
then to a pine tree marked in Lt Wheelers Land then to a Rock or
y brook so to a Pine marked in Lt wheelers land then to y Copeway
