 being legally warned as Appeared by the Returns of  
 the Constables: Mr Joseph Fletcher was Chosen moderator  
 for sd meeting & proceeded as folloeth: Simon Hunt was  
 Chosen Town Clerk Samuel Hayward 1st Constable  
 David Furbush was Chosen 2d Constable  
 Simon Hunt Andrew Derby & John Brooks was Chosen  
 Select men & Assessors Jonathan Billing was Chosen Treasurer  
 Ammi Falker Timothy Brooks Mark White Samuel  
 Davis Daniel Sheperd Zecariah Emery Surveyors of high-  
 ways: John Davis Dr. John Freym Deers men: Josiah pipe

April 7<sup>th</sup> 1744  
 being notified by the select men of Littleton to perambulate  
 the line between the Towns of Littleton and Acton  
 Capt Joseph Baker and Deacon Caleb Taylor of  
 of Littleton and John Emery and Andrew Derby of Acton  
 did Joyn in the affair and began at the southern ty  
 part of a white oak 1 to a heap of stones 2 a black oak  
 3 a white oak 4 to a heap of stones 5 to a white oak  
 6 to a white oak about 14 Rods East of fort pond Brook

May 14 1744  
 Being notified by the select men of Billerica to perambulate  
 the line between the Towns of Billerica and Acton Capt Richard  
 and Christopher Asgill of Billerica and Deacon John Heath and  
 Andrew Derby of Acton did Joyn in the affair and began at  
 a white oak between the two Towns Billerica running south  
 to a white oak then a black oak then to a heap of stones at  
 the corner then turning south East to a white oak in  
 Joseph Parlins wall
