I am the above described claimant and in relation to the injury of right arm for which I claim a pension I say that it was received in the following manner:

In July 1869 I was employed by the Boston Ice Co. and while I was engaged in unloading a ^{load} ~~car~~ of ice from the wagon the horses became frightened and suddenly started, throwing me from the side of the rear end of the wagon and one of the prongs of the ice tongs caught in the hind wheel and the other prong caught in the fleshy part of my right fore arm lacerating it so badly as to cause a paralysis of said arm.

..... further declare that..... no interest in said case, and..... not concerned in its prosecution, and..... not related to said claimant.

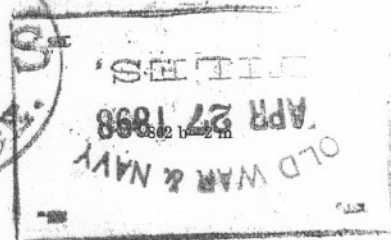
