## DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be Executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having Custody of its Seal.

Faulkner, aged 51 years, a resident of the Town of Medford, county of Middlesex, State of Mass, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Winthrop H. Faulkner who enlisted under the name of Winthrop H. Faulkner, at Kansas on the 12 day of October, A.D. 1861, in Private in Co H 7<sup>th</sup> Kansas Cavalry Regt.

and served at least ninety days in the late war of the rebellion, who was honorably discharged Dec 5/1864 and died March 10 1865 [The cause of death need not be stated.]

That she was married under the name of Caroline Gage to said Winthrop A. Faulkner on the 22 day of Nov 18 65 by J. J. Quiss, at Lowell, there being no legal barrier to said marriage
