

DECLARATION OF A WIDOW FOR ACCRUED PENSION.

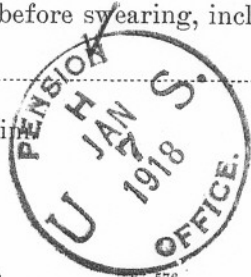

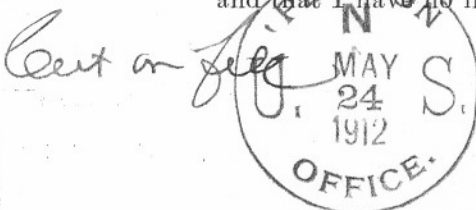

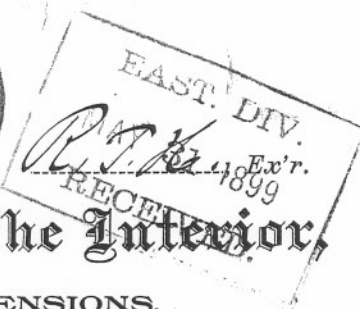
