I am unable to furnish evidence of any persons as to the incurrence of fracture of the instep of my right foot. This occurred so long ago, and I have been away from Woburn so long that I have been unable to find any person who was knowing to the fact. It must have been 15 years ago instead of 10 as stated in a former affidavit, but I have no data to fix the time except the fact that I have lived in Arlington 15 years. The Dr (Winn) who attended me at that time is now dead - and I can find no person in Woburn who remembers it.

I have known Henry Gilson for 30 years and am personally acquainted with the fact that about the winter of 1886 he accidentally fell on an icy sidewalk in Arlington Mass and fractured the left knee pan. He lives adjoining my stable and I knew that the injury was received as stated & was not the result of vicious habits.

I also knew that about 6 years ago he accidentally slipped on the floor at his boarding house in Arlington Mass & fell down the stairs and I carried him home in my carriage he having fractured the ankle of his left foot. He is a heavy man and inclined to be clumsy. This disability I am sure is not due to vicious habits.
