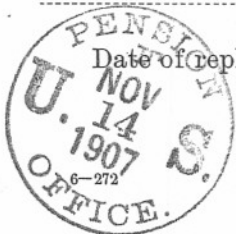

 State of Massachusetts; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Reading Mass
 on the 17th day of September, 1862, as a private, in
Company F. 45th Regiment Mass. Volunteer Militia
 (Here state rank, and company and regiment in the Army, or vessels if in the Navy.)
 in the service of the United States, in the Civil war, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED
 at Reading Mass, on the 7th day of July, 1863.
 That he also served

 description at enlistment was as follows: Height, 5 feet 7 inches; complexion, light; color of

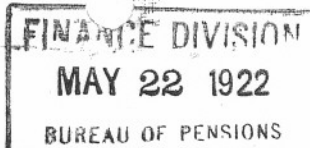
