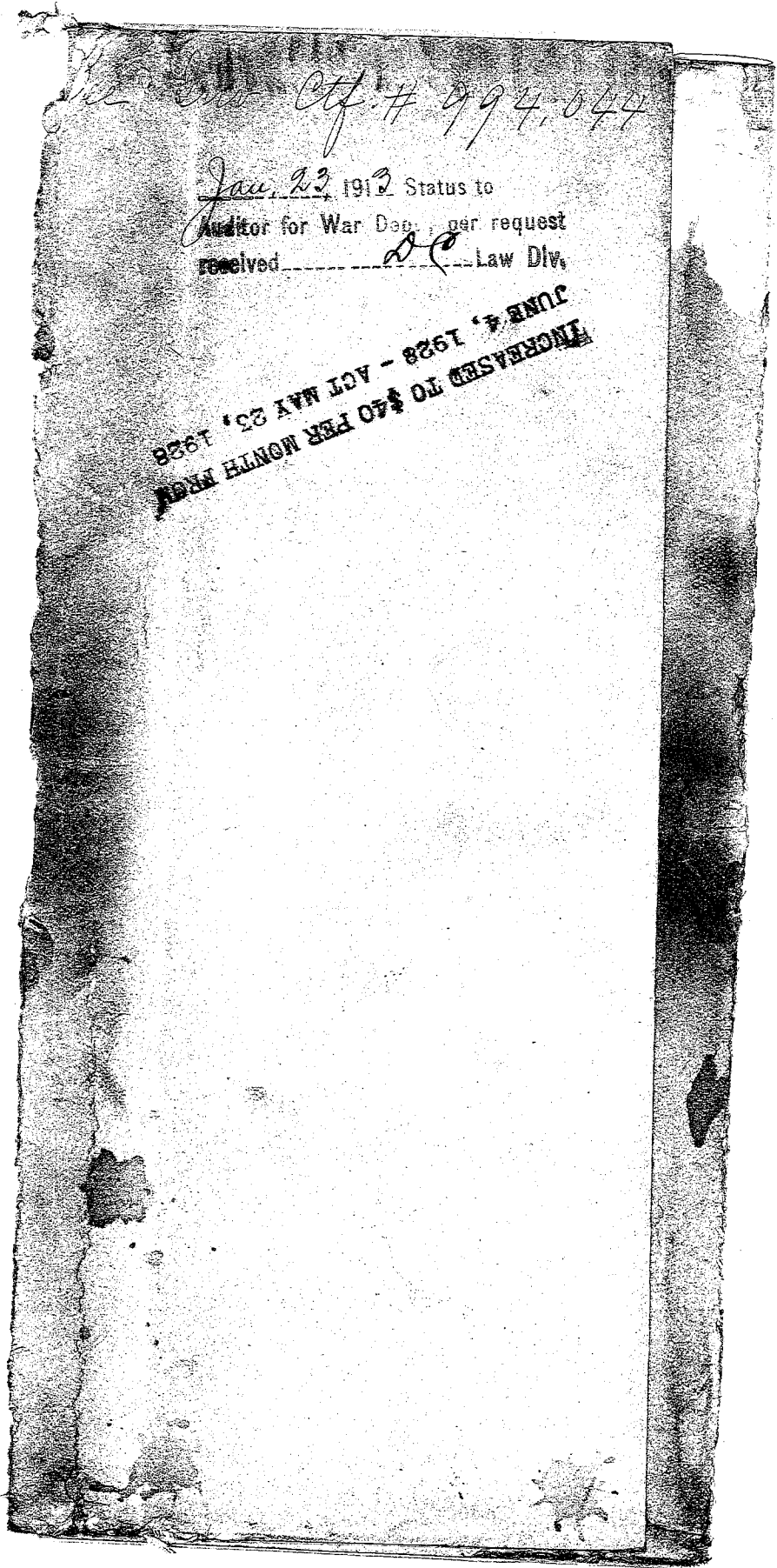

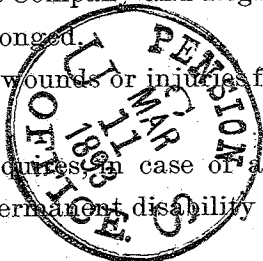

The Act of June 27, 1890, requires in case of a Soldier: An honorable discharge. A minimum service of ninety days. Permanent disability not due to his vicious habits, which need not have originated in the service.

The rates under the act are graded from \$6 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support. The rates are not effected by the rank held.

A pensioner under prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under any other laws, but cannot draw more than one pension for the same period.

Vols. and was returning home after being dismissed from a tour of duty. At the corner of Court and Howard Sts. Boston, Mass my horse slipped on the smooth flagging and fell and before I could get my foot out of the stirrup he rolled over on my right knee and sprained it. I was alone at the time and no members of my company saw me when the horse fell and I did not report to my commander in regard to it as I did not think any injury had been done at the time. I cannot get the testimony of two persons having personal knowledge of the facts for the reason that none but citizens were passing by on the street at the time who asked me if my leg was broken and I answered them no, and passed on. It was sore for a few days and then I thought it was well but the following winter I found that it was very weak and by moving my foot a certain way the knee would go out of joint and I have been very careful with it ever since. As I grow older it troubles me more.

This has reference to your letter dated February 6, 1941 wherein you refer to availability of any funds which might be applicable for payment on burial expenses of \$250.00 in the case of Mrs. Hannah A. Jones, Civil War widow beneficiary who died January 24, 1941.

According to the records, the only amount which may be available for payment toward the expenses of the decedent's last illness and burial would be the pension accruing from December 31, 1940, date of last payment, to January 24, 1941, alleged date of death, at the rate of \$40.00 per month.

This amount (although not an asset of the estate and not payable to heirs nor to an administrator or executor as such and not liable for payment of debts) may, under certain conditions, be paid to the person who bore the expenses of last illness and burial or who is held responsible therefor, in the event decedent is not survived by a child under sixteen years of age and did not leave sufficient assets to meet such expenses.

If it is desired to file claim for any accrued amount payable in this case, the enclosed Form 5036 may be completed by the proper person as determined by the facts and in accordance with printed instructions.


