I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 67,870., and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Daniel A. Loring was enrolled on the 6th day of Aug., 1862, at Stone Mts. in Co. H., 13th Regiment of Mass. Volunteers, to serve 2 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Recruit on the 6th day of Aug., 1862, at Stone Mts., in Co. H., 13th Regiment of Mass. Volunteers, to serve 2 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. H. of that Regiment, for the months of May and June, 1864, he is reported "Killed in action June 3rd 1864."

WIDOW'S CLAIM FOR AN INCREASE OF PENSION.

State of Massachusetts
COUNTY OF Middlesex ss.

On this 12 day of Oct. 1866, personally appeared before me,
a Judge of a Court of Record in the County and State aforesaid,
Oliver M. Lovering, a resident of Stoughton in the County of
Middlesex State of Massachusetts
aged forty seven years, who, being duly sworn, declares that she is the widow of
Daniel A. Lovering, who died in the (1) Military
service of the United States, on the 12 day of June 1864, while (2)
a Private Co "I" 13 Regt. Mass. Vols.
; and that she has remained a widow since the death of
said Daniel A. Lovering. That by reason of the death of her husband,
as aforesaid, she received a Pension Certificate No. 38189 and that she is a Pensioner of the
United States, duly enrolled at the Pension Agency at Boston in the
State of Massachusetts, at \$ 8 per month. That the following

are the names, date of birth, and present place of residence, of all of the
children of her deceased husband, who are now under sixteen years of age, to wit, Mary F.
born April 26. 1851 Correll C. born Dec 23. 1853. Winifred
born January 20. 1855. Henry G. born Dec. 2. 1856. All reside with
claimant.

She further declares that she has not abandoned the support of any one of the children above-named, nor per-
mitted any one of the same to be adopted by any other person or persons, as his, her, or their child.
That she surrenders the aforesaid Pension Certificate No. 38189, and makes this application for the
purpose of obtaining the increased rate of pension authorized by the act "increasing the pensions
of widows and orphans," approved July 25, 1866; that she hereby constitutes and appoints
Charles L. Bell of Boston
her true and lawful attorney, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to
receive and receipt for all orders or certificates that may be issued in consequence thereof, hereby
revoking all Powers of Attorney, if any, heretofore given by her for a like purpose. My
Post Office address is Stowe Mass.

true and correct, and that the said statement is believed to be true and correct in the community in
which they resided.

They further swear that they, or either of them, have no interest in this claim, either present
or prospective, and that they are not concerned, directly or indirectly, in its prosecution.
