

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

NOTE.—This can be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer uses a seal, certificate of Clerk of Court is not necessary. If no seal is used, then such certificate must be attached.

and served at least ninety days in the late war of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED on the

3rd day of June 1863, and died Nov. 2nd 1876

That she was married under the name of Maria M. Brackett, to said

William Merrill, on the 29 day of September

1858, by Rev Mr. Converse, at Burlington N H

there being no legal barrier to such marriage

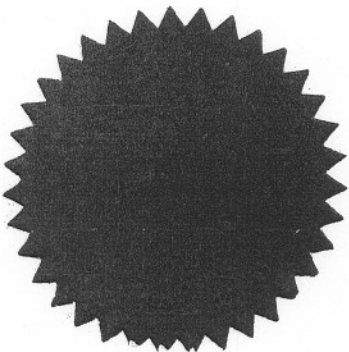
