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

him, she seemed to take a special delight in doing those things which would embarrass him; that one evening in the year 1898, upon his return home he found that his wife and children had left his home and taken all the furniture with them; that woon inquiry he learned that they had moved to a son's home, and when he went there he was unable to induce the claimant to return; that in order to preserve harmony in the family he took up his abode at the home of said son; that the claimant, without any cause or reason, refused to have anything to death him and would not speak to him; that she roomed with one of her daughters and he with one of his sons; that shortly after this he was assaulted in the house by one of his sons, who struck him over the head with an iron poker and drove him from the house; that he lived separate and apart from them from that time until February 4, 1904, when through the intervention of mutual friends he was again permitted to take up his abode at the home of his son on Columbia Avenue; that upon going there he found the claimant of the same obstinate disposition; that she refused to speak, or to have anything whatever to do with him, except to take whatever money he brought home; that while claimant and he had their abode in the same house he could not have a

word with her as she refused to recognize him for a sufficient length of time to even answer his questions; that this condition continued until June, 1905, when his son approached him in a very threatening manner and demanded some money; that remembering the circl treatment accorded him when he was driven from the house on a former occasion, he told claimant that he could not remain there and asked her to go with him to establish a home elsewhere; that she refused to do so; that since he was thus forced to leave the home of his son he has requested the claimant to come and live with him, and has also written her counsel relative to a resumption of marital relations, which letter was returned to him with the information that she would not have anything to do with him; that he is ready and willing to corget the past and will gladly welcome claimant if she will come back to him, as he is still willing to exert every effort to properly maintain and support her; that two of his sons conduct a lunch room at 404 Cemden St., from which they derive a good income; that the claimant cooks for them and they, together with the other children, live at the home which he is not permitted to enter.

The claimant is at liberty to file her own sworn statement in answer to each and all the above allegations of the pensioner, and any statements that she may make relative to the same should be supported in full by the testimony of several credible witnesses having personal knowledge of the facts to which they testify, for which purpose thirty days from the date of receipt of this letter will be allowed.

All evidence must be under oath, and the witnesses must state their names in full, ages, post-office addresses (with street and number, or route, if any), and means of knowledge of the facts to which they testify; and their credibility should be certified to by the officer before whom the affidavits are executed, if he can consistently do so, in his own handwriting.



#### AN ACT

GRANTING PENSIONS TO CERTAIN ENLISTED MEN, SOLDIERS, AND OFFICERS WHO SERVED IN THE CIVIL

WAR AND THE WAR WITH MEXICO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled:

That any person who served ninety days or more in the military or naval service of the United States during the late civil war, or sixty days in the war with Mexico, and who has been honorably discharged therefrom, and who has reached the age of sixty-two years or over, shall, upon making proof of such facts according to such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may provide, be placed upon the pension roll, and be entitled to receive a pension as follows: In case such person has reached the age of sixty-two years, twelve dollars per month; seventy years, fifteen dollars per month; seventy-five years or over, twenty dollars per month; and such pension shall commence from the date of the filing of the application in the Bureau of Pensions after the passage and approval of this Act: Provided, that pensioners who are sixty-two years of age or over, and who are now receiving pensions under existing laws, or whose claims are pending in the Bureau of Pensions, may, by application to the Commissioner of Pensions, in such form as he may prescribe, receive the benefits of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent any pensioner or person entitled to a pension from prosecuting his claim and receiving a pension under any other general or special act: Provided, that no person shall receive a pension under any other law at the same time or for the same period that he is receiving a pension under the provisions of this Act: Provided, further, that no person who is now receiving or shall hereafter receive a greater pension under any other general or special law than he would be entitled to receive under the provisions herein shall be pensionable under this Act.

- Sec. 2. That rank in the service shall not be considered in applications filed hereunder.
- Sec. 3. That no pension attorney, claim agent, or other person shall be entitled to receive any compensation for services rendered in presenting any claim to the Bureau of Pensions, or securing any pension, under this Act.



- 5. A pensioner uncer prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under other laws, but he cannot draw more than one pension for the same period.






