The medical records show him treated as follows: Ad Jos. Smith Pri. Co. H, 8 Me. V., June 8/64 (no diag. notes); Ad J. B. Smith & Co. June 10 to 16/64, contusion of back by fence rail, wounded at Drury's Bluff, May 20/64; June 19/64 to Apr. 5/65 U.S. Md Rt Hip, wounded at Drury's Bluff, May 16/64, ret'd to duty & as Joseph B. Smith & Co. Apr. 29 to May 30/65. Syphilis disch'd from system. Nothing additional found.
