DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

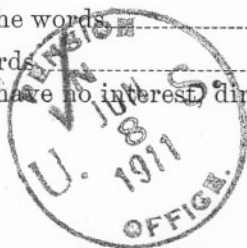

Certificate to enable a Disabled Soldier to obtain a Pension.

I hereby certify on honor, that Daniel G. Taylor
 was a private in Company "E" Twenty Sixth
Regiment Massachusetts Volunteers, and that while doing
 duty with his Company at Ship Island Miss.
 about the 20th day of March 1862 he injured his
 left leg while on regimental drill by stumbling over a plank
 laid down for the moving of Quater masters stores etc, so
 that he was unable to do duty afterwards. He also con-
 tracted a trouble in his lungs by exposure while on
 guard duty, the men having frequently been obliged to
 keep in clothes drenched by rain and to lie on the
 wet ground. He was in good health at the time of enlist-
 ment.

And I hereby certify that the above mentioned Daniel G.
Taylor contracted this disease was injured as stated while in the
 line of duty and in the service of the United States.

ACT OF JULY 14, 1862.

Declaration for an Invalid Pension.

State of Massachusetts }
County of Suffolk }
On this fourth day of July, A. D. one thousand
eight hundred and sixty-three personally appeared before me George White
a Judge of the Probate Court within and for the county and State aforesaid,
Daniel G. Taylor aged 27 years, a resident of Acton

in the State of Massachusetts who being duly sworn according
to law, declares that he is the identical Daniel G. Taylor who enlisted
in the service of the United States at Acton aforesaid on the seventh day of
September in the year 1861 as a Private in Company "E"
by William W. Chapman in the Twenty-fifth Regiment of Massa-
chusetts Vol. Inf. in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the twenty eighth
day of September in the year 1862;

that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his
duty, he was injured in the left leg while at Ship Island, Miss. about
the twentieth of March 1862, by stepping on a plank while on a
log while on the "double quick". The plank was slightly elevated
from the ground, as it was resting on blocks at either end, making it at a height
of about eight inches from the ground. It was hit from above by others
passing over it, and when applicant reached it, the end of his foot struck
it, and his weight coming suddenly on his heel, he fell back
in the leg and crippling it. He was immediately sent to the Hospital,
and was discharged from Hospital at New Orleans. While in the
hospital at New Orleans, he began to be troubled with violent pains in his
left side and across with cold chills, caused in his opinion by getting wet and ly-
ing on the ground with drenched clothes after guard duty at Ship Island.
In his present condition, he is troubled with a cough, dizziness and a sense of weakness
and is wholly unfit for business or labor. His leg is lame and weak and it troubles
him to walk on it.

He hereby appoints CHARLES REED, of Boston, Mass., his Attorney, to prosecute this claim, and to
receive the Pension Certificate.
