Campbell to include the 31st day of December, 1863, and has
pay due him from that time to the present date; he is entitled to pay and subsistence for
TRAVELING to place of enrollment, and whatever other allowances are authorized to volunteer
soldiers, drafted men, or militia, so discharged. He has received from the United States **CLOTHING**
amounting to Eighteen ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ dollars, since the 16th day of July,
1863, when his clothing account was last settled. He has received from the United States
Twenty five ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ dollars advanced **BOUNTY**.

(TRANSCRIPT FROM RECORDS.)

It appears from the records filed in this Office, (List of wounded in the 3^d brigade 3^d Div. 20th A. C. Army of the Cumberland, in the various actions in Northern Ga. from May 3^d to Sept 6th 1864.) that L. W. Bowers, Corp. Co. "C" 33^d Mass. Vol. received a flesh wound left thigh and hip, at Resaca Ga. May 15th 1864, disposition not stated. Was admitted to hospital of 3^d Div. 20th A. C. May 15th 1864, with flesh wound left thigh & hip, and was transferred to the rear, date not stated. The records of General Field hospital, Army of the Cumberland, and Death & Discharge records of this Office furnish no information in this case. The records of G. F. Hospl. 20th A. C. for 1864, are not on file in this Office.
