period of **THREE YEARS** unless sooner discharged by proper authority: Do also
agree to accept such bounty, pay, rations, and clothing, as are, or may be, established
by law for volunteers. And I, Nathan Goss do
solemnly swear, that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the **UNITED STATES**
OF AMERICA, and that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their
enemies or opposers whomsoever, and that I will observe and obey the orders of the
President of the United States, and the orders of the officers appointed over me,
according to the Rules and Articles of War.

The mustering officer, commissary, or assistant commissary of musters, as the case may be, will countersign both enlistments as having mustered the soldier into the service of the United States before either of them is given to the disbursing officer.

I enlisted in Acton Mass on 3rd of Sept 1861 for 3 years, I joined and served with my Regt until the 1st of Jan'y 1864, when I was discharged by reason of re-enlistment for 3 years at New Orleans, La. I continued to serve until the 23rd of Jan'y 1865, when I rec'd a furlough for 15 days at Winchester Vt. to visit my home. I lost my furlough 5 days before my time was up, and was arrested by a Detective on the 5th of February 1865 at Boston Mass. while I was after my Ticket to reform my Regt. I was taken before the Prov Mar who sent me to Pennic Street Military Prison, Ark. Ct.
