To an order to Deacon Holmer of two pounds eight shillings and ten pence for keeping school in the southeast part of the town 2: 8 - 10

March 17: 1756

To an order to Capt Davis for one pound ^{six} shillings & four pence for his son Nathan keeping school in the northeast part of the town 1: 6 - 4

March 17 - 1756

To an order to Samuel Wheeler of one pound six shillings & four pence for his service in keeping school in the northeast part of the town 1: 6 - 4

April 30th 1756

To an order to Mr Francis Eveleth for one pound nineteen shillings and one penny for his service in keeping school in Eps Haywards part of the town it being in full for that part 1 - 19 - 1

April 30th 1756

To an order to Mr Francis Eveleth for one pound sixteen shillings & ten pence for his service in keeping of school in the middle part of the town 1 - 16 - 10

August 1st 1756

To an order to Mr John Adams by Deacon of Samuel Wright for his service in keeping school in the middle part of the town it being in full for that part 1 - 18 - 3

April 19th 1756

Where the select of acton and the select men of Carlisle met to renew the bounds between the town of acton and the District of Carlisle and began at a black oak near Mr William Cannatts standing in the line between acton & Carlisle and renewed the same by laying stones about it and from thence Northwesterly to a rock & a heap of stones on it and renewed the same from thence to a heap of stones near John Edwards his house and renewed the same & from thence to a heap of stones at the Glen pump and renewed the same from thence to a white oak stump and a heap of stones on the same and renewed it as it was allowed to be the line between Concord & acton by a Committee from the great and general Court from thence to a pitch pine tree which acton challenged for the line between acton & Carlisle and renewed the same by laying of stones about it from thence to a white oak tree (called Berry Corner which was renewed by each party

The person that performed to work from acton was John Davis junr and Mr John Craigin and from Carlisle Mr Benjamin Brown and Mr John Green and Mr William Fletcher

May 13: 1756

To an order to Lieut Prillings for one pound four shillings and six pence school money to be kept for the use of the school in that part 1: 4: 3
