Armand, Glenda

All aboard the schooltrain (2023)

Climbing aboard a "train" to a better life, third grader Thelma joins other African American children on the walk to school. Drawing on family history, the author reframes her mother Thelma's childhood as a series of imagined train rides—first to a one-room school, then, in class, further on to dazzling destinations like Oz and Treasure Island and back in time to hear about Harriet Tubman and other heroes.

J PICBOOK DICKINSON

Dickinson, Emily

Hope is the thing with feathers (2024)

Emily Dickinson's classic is brought to life in vibrant hues. In the beginning, a variety of tiny birds dance across the page, as a young pencil-outlined child collects a dropped feather. The lines of the poem alternate pages, as the child, friends, neighbors, and birds weather rain and wind, but still come out smiling.

Edwards Richmond, Susan

Bioblitz!: Counting Critters (2022)

You might be amazed at the large number of insects, birds, and small mammals that inhabit even a very small plot of land. In this story Gabriel's dad, a ranger for the local municipal park, is helping with a Biodiversity Day (or Bioblitz), and he invites Gabriel and his cousin Ava to participate.

At the poles (2023)

The stark, cold landscapes of Earth's poles may seem inhospitable, but their snowy hollows and glacial waters hide an astounding variety of creatures, from the tiny, fascinating tardigrade to the mysterious giant squid, from the fleet-footed Arctic hare to the majestic polar bear.

No cats in the library (2024)

Clarisse, a stray cat, is fond of books, and she sometimes eavesdrops on adults reading to children. Though unable to interpret the "dark, squiggly lines" of text, she enjoys looking at the pictures. When she discovers a public library, she's determined to get inside. Attempting to enter through the door, she is turned away. Undeterred, she slides down the book-drop chute!

Two friends are a happy team, building bigger and more elaborate constructions together--which, seen through their eyes, become elaborate fantasy creations, like gently smiling sea dragons and city-destroying monsters. But every finished project somehow ends up in pieces. As little guys, they laugh over the disasters and start again with even bigger dreams. But when their truly magnificent floating construction crashes to earth, the ever-frustrated older boys are ready to call it quits as friends.

J PicBook Lindstrom Lindstrom, Carole We are Water Protectors (2020)

An Indigenous girl explains why water is sacred, before she speaks of the foretold black snake that will destroy the land, referring to the polluting oil pipelines that course through the earth.

J PICBOOK RUNDELL Rundell, Katherine The zebra's great escape (2024)

Mink, awake long after other children are in bed, hears a strange noise and goes to investigate. She's astonished to find a baby zebra in the foliage. Mink sneaks Gabriel up to her apartment bedroom (no easy task) and learns he's been separated from his parents and is desperate to be reunited. The unlikely pair formulates a plan to find Gabriel's family.

I Talk Like a River (2020)

Sometimes a few words can transform a child's life. In this autobiographical story, a boy who stutters is given a new way to think about his speech.

A child and her family take in refugees during the Korean War in this poignant picture book about courage and what it really means to care for your neighbors.

Kapaemahu (2022)

According to legend, four dual-spirited travelers (known as mahu) journeyed from Tahiti to Hawaii, bringing their gentle ways and miraculous cures. To thank the mahu for their gifts, Hawaiians transported four large boulders to Waikiki Beach, and the mahu transferred their healing powers to the stones. Revered for generations, the stones were forgotten during colonial times but have since been recovered.

A look at the life and work of an early-20th-century African American botanist. Charles S. Parker, a young plant enthusiast from Spokane, grew up to do pioneering research on ferns and fungi throughout the country. His studies of one genus of fungi—*Hypholoma*—yielded new species that now bear his name.

J BIO RAMIREZ, M. RAMIREZ, M. Daughter of the light-footed people (2024)

From the copper canyons of Mexico her swift footsteps echo. Clip clap, clip clap. Experience a 60-mile run with indigenous athlete Lorena Ramirez, who captured the world's attention when she won an ultramarathon in Mexico wearing a skirt and rubber sandals-the traditional clothes of the Rarámuri, "the light-footed people".

Junko Tabei was the first woman to summit Mt. Everest. Junko loved hiking as a child and as an adult joined a mountaineering club in Tokyo. She led a mostly female expedition to Mt. A tour of the body full of amazing numbers and fantastic facts. Learn about cells, the senses, the stomach, bones and muscles, the lungs and heart, and everything that makes the body tick!

J 612.11 McA McAnulty, Stacy Blood! Not just a vampire drink (2022)

This funny and fact-filled picture book is all about blood: where it's found, what it does, how it travels, and why vampires shouldn't drink it! From the four chambers of the heart to the platelets that clot your blood when you scrape your knee, everything you want to know about the cardiovascular system is right inside these pages. Just watch out for thirsty vampires!

J 629.1097 ROT Roth, Jonathan

Almost underwear: the how a piece of cloth traveled from Kitty Hawk to the Moon and Mars (2024)

Travel back in time to 1903 and meet a seemingly ordinary piece of fabric, originally destined to be made into women's underwear. Instead, who should purchase the bolt but the Wright brothers, using it as the wing cover for the Flyer, which would soon make history as the first airplane to be successfully airborne. After its first-of-a-kind journey, the fabric was cut into swatches and donated to a museum. However, its adventures did not end there: one swatch made it to the moon in 1969 with Neil Armstrong, while still another landed on the surface of Mars in 2021.

J 629.89 SPI Spiro, Ruth

How to explain robotics to a grown-up (2023)

In this tongue-in-cheek guide, a kid expert explains to young readers how to teach their grown-ups about the basics of robotics. A fantastic resource for introducing children to robotics.

J 636.73 POT Potter, Melisande Togo to the Rescue (2024)

Togo, a Siberian Husky born in Alaska in 1913, led a dog team in the historic serum-run to save the lives of children suffering from diphtheria in Nome in 1925. A brutal blizzard that year necessitated the use of 150 dogs to relay medicine from the capitol to Nome over the course of five days.

J 811.54 WES Westera, Bette Fast cheetah, slow tortoise (2024)

How do you contrast creatures as different as cheetahs and tortoises, or as similar as butterflies and moths? In this lively book of poetry, antonym pairs introduce thirty-two members of the animal kingdom. Each spread presents the voices of two unique creatures: are you more like an obedient sheep or a rebellious goat? What about a tidy pig or a messy warthog? A bossy gorilla or a meek monkey?

J 841.92 SIM Simler, Isabelle Home (2024)

Twenty-seven poems look inside the dwellings of animals like elf owls, cathedral termites, Sumatran orangutans, and foam-nest tree frogs. Enchanting poetry, fascinating back facts, and intricately detailed art invite young readers to be amazed by the creativity and diversity of our animal neighbors.

Antarctica is a land of extremes -- the coldest, windiest, highest, and driest place on the planet. It's a world where the sun stays hidden half of the year and where visitors must undergo a week of special training before it's safe to go outside (watch out for lava bombs!). It's also a place of stark beauty, history, and endless scientific research.
